
Approved June 2018 Service Changes

Background: Connections 2025

- Board approved transit plan
- 10-year vision for more reliable, more frequent, better connected network
- Guides 3x per year service changes
- Over a year of public & board input established network

Connections 2025 Implementation

January 2017

- Elimination of Premium Fare level
 - Lowered the cost of taking MetroRapid & MetroFlyer routes
- 30% MetroRapid ridership increase

August 2017

- MetroRapid frequency & service span increase
 - 10 minute frequency on weekdays / 15 minute frequency on weekends

January 2018

- Northwest express bus network redesign
- June 2018
 - Major system overhaul
 - Implement frequent network increase from 6 to 14 routes
 - More than half of routes changing (38 of 82 unchanged), 13 routes to be eliminated





Benefits of the June 2018 Changes

Benefits of the June 2018 Changes



More Frequent

- 14 High-Frequency Routes
- Departures at least every
 15 minutes
- 7 days a week



More Reliable

- More direct routing
- Eliminates route deviations within neighborhoods
- Easier to understand system



Better Connected

- Routes designed to work as a system
- Decreased waiting time for your next bus
- Riders able to transfer with more confidence



• Route eliminations: 21/22, 37, 122, 320, 338, 464 & 653





Windsor Park Neighborhood Area

Frequent Routes

- Route 10 South 1st/Red River
 - Redirected to serve Berkman Dr
- Route 20 Manor Rd/Riverside
 - Extends to ABIA
- Route 300 Springdale
 - Redirected to 51st St and Cameron Rd

Route Adjustments

- Routes 37 and 320 along Cameron Rd
 - Services replaced by Route 300
- Route 300 eliminated along Rogge Ln
- Route 337 Koenig / Loyola
 - New E/W connection (replaces 37)

- San Jacinto & Trinity


Frequency Improvements

Service Adjustments

- Route 17 will operate east-west on Cesar Chavez
- Service pulled off Congress & Red River, and portions of 4th, 5th, 11th & 12th Streets
