# **\$1,000 SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY**

FOR LBJ, REAGAN, AND LASA SENIORS WHO LIVE IN WINDSOR PARK

The Windsor Park Schools Committee has raised \$2,000 in local donations for two scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 each, for Reagan, LASA, or LBJ High School seniors who will be attending a 2- or 4-year college in 2018-2019

The committee is interested in supporting students who care deeply about giving back to their community. All eligible applicants and encouraged to **apply by March 26th, 2018**.

#### **Eligibility Requirements**

To be eligible to apply, a student must meet the following minimum requirements:

Be a Reagan, LBJ, or LASA High School senior who will be attending a 2- or 4-year college in 2018-2019.

Have at least a 2.5 GPA, or have demonstrated GPA growth over time.

Be involved in community service. The community we refer to can be family, neighborhood, school, or church related.

Be a resident of Windsor Park. The boundary streets for the Windsor Park neighborhood are:

- I-35 to the West
- Hwy 290E to the North
- Northeast Drive and Manor Road to the East
- 51st Street to the South

**To apply:** Completed online applications must be received by Monday, March 26th, 2018.

#### Part I: Student Basic Information

In this section, you will be asked to provide contact information for you and your parent(s) or guardian(s), as well as basic information about your school.

#### Part II: Short Essay Questions

Answer each question in <u>300 words or less</u>. Pay close attention to the "strong response" guidance provided below, and take full advantage of the word limit to expand on your answers. Please spell-check your responses before submitting them.

- 1) In what ways are you involved in the community?
- 2) In what ways has that involvement shaped you?

#### Part III: Letters of Recommendation and grades transcript

Please submit two Letters of Recommendation – one from a teacher or counselor who can speak to your community involvement and one from someone in the community, such as a pastor, mentor, volunteer supervisor, employer, etc. Please refer to the additional guidance provided below.

Please provide a copy of your grades transcript starting with your freshman year in High School. You must request this from your school's Registrar's office.

## Short Essay guidance

**Question #1: In what ways are you involved in the community?** This may include volunteering in local organizations, but you may also choose to share the responsibilities you have assumed after school, such as working to supplement your family's income, or caring for a family member. A strong response will include details such as the duties and responsibilities of the role(s) you've undertaken, the time committed (per week/month), how long you've been involved, and what motivated you to become involved. Avoid simply listing roles, choose instead to write a short narrative. If you have many examples you may list several, but then, focus on one or two instead and expand on your motivation to become involved.

Question #2 In what ways has that involvement shaped you? Share your reflections on the lessons you've learned through community involvement, work, or service towards others. Alternatively, if you have benefited from community services, you may choose to write about how such services have had an impact in your life. A strong response will include how your experiences have impacted the way you think about your role as a young adult in the community, and the potential that community service has to make communities stronger.

**Please note:** The scoring rubrics for the short essay responses and the recommendation letter responses are provided for your reference at the end of this document.

## **Letters of Recommendation**

The Windsor Park Neighborhood Association (WPNA) provides scholarships for high school seniors who reside in our neighborhood and attend one of our three neighborhood schools in AISD: Reagan, LASA, or LBJ.

#### Guidance for recommenders:

The scholarship will be awarded to students who have demonstrated commitment to their community, either through service, leadership, volunteering, or by taking on responsibilities such as caring for a family member, or being employed to supplement their family's income.

## In your recommendation letter, please describe the ways in which this student embodies commitment to the community and strength of character as defined above.

#### Guidance for student requesting the letters of recommendation:

- While not required, consider sharing your short-answer essays with your recommender when you approach him or her to request a recommendation letter. This will help them craft a letter that complements your application and grounds their comments on your own reflections.
- Give your recommender as much advance notice as possible when requesting the letter, ideally at least 30 days, but never less than 2 weeks. Make sure that you take this time into account to avoid missing the application deadline.
