### WINDSOR PARK LISTED AS HOT REAL ESTATE MARKET

The end of 2014 finds Windsor Park in the unenviable position of being the hottest real estate area of Austin, which is the hottest city in America. This is an unofficial statement overheard at a meeting of agents, and could be just one person's opinion, but it appears to be true. I receive no less than five offers a week, in the mail, to buy my house. I have neighbors and clients complaining about real estate brokers and agents soliciting at their homes. If you are a homeowner experiencing this onslaught of marketing, it may be time for a new sign to go up in your yard: HOME NOT FOR SALE.

But that is not going to stop what is really happening here: market growth brought by population explosion. Today the long lines of cars traveling down Berkman and Cameron and 51st during rush hour are testament to the actual changes in our here and now. Who knew it could take minutes to make a left turn? Or to simply cross the street?

It is clear the Austin we used to know is moments away from non-existence, and maybe has been for quite some time. The question is: will it become a city of haves and have-nots? Will the inexorable march to free market value really make Austin a better place, or just those pockets of neighborhoods that happen to be mostly west of I35?

The real reason Windsor Park is hot is that we are still considered a bargain, even at 3 times the per foot cost of just 20 years ago. Imagine how expensive homes will be in 2030 if that rate of value continues? The average home will be worth more than half a million

dollars. How can anyone afford to buy them, much less pay the property tax? So I will repeat this again and again: we must get control of our growth, before the middle class is no longer in the middle.

Capitalism at its heart is a boom and bust system. There have been a dozen of these "business cycles" since the 1940s, even with legislation to counter the problem. Rapid growth is almost certainly followed by sudden collapse, and Austin is currently blowing up with high speed growth.

We need to demand from our newly elected City Council a way to control the growth of this town, which is a runaway train headed for either a crazy bust, or a two-tiered society where the haves all move in from somewhere else and the have-nots are forced to sell out, and the middle class lives in Elgin and Manor and Smithville, far away from the center of Windsor Park.

### December 2014 Yard of the Month

The address of the December winner is 1302 Ludlow Terrace. It is a rental owned by Lindsey Schell. The tenants are Jake and Grace Petry. Lindsey designed the landscape in 2010 and had her maintenance crew install it. A grassy yard with a broken sidewalk was transformed into a xeric landscape with granite paths and a variety of plants. Though Lindsey's landscape crew does the basic maintenance, the Petrys do the everyday weeding.

Lindsey suggests installing the hardscape first. In this case, it is the concrete blocks that make a new sidewalk and the granite paths that meander through the yard. The latter and the Rosemary hedge are Lindsey's favorite parts of the design. The rest of the yard is covered in small stones.

The other plants include Passionflower, Coral Honeysuckle, Mexican Bush Sage, several Agaves, Bamboo Muhly, Turkscap, Mexican Aloe, Butterfly Weed, Globe Mallow, Gopher Plant, Coral Yucca, and Orange Esparanza. The aloes are her favorite plants because a friend and Windsor Park neighbor gave them to her.


Lindsey suggests planning the design, installing the hardscape and planting last. She also suggests using native and climate adapted plants.

### December 2014 Mueller Update

2014 at Mueller was a busy year. Last December's opening of the Thinkery led to far larger-than-anticipated crowds visiting the great new facility. The HEB also continues to attract customers from well beyond Mueller and Windsor Park, and those living on Berkman have been asking for help with the subsequent traffic. Special-event parking overflow and some other related issues have led the City and Catellus to propose a Parking & Traffic Management District pilot program for Mueller, elements of which will start to be implemented early next year, including a number of metered

parking spaces. TXDOT's improvement plans for central Austin proposed closing several bridges spanning I-35 to cross traffic – the "super-street" concept – that Mueller, Windsor Park and other area neighborhoods managed to vanquish.

In February, Residence Inn–University Area finally opened, but no cafe or coffee shop has yet leased their corner space at Lancaster & 51<sup>st</sup>. Among some other Mueller businesses opening this year were Capitol One, Twin Liquors, Smashburger and Xian Sushi & Noodles, but sadly, Boneheads restaurant did not make it through the year. And lastly - Torchy's Tacos opened on November 20<sup>th</sup>.

With the failure of a 2013 AISD bond package for a new northeast elementary, Catellus conducted several surveys and public meetings regarding the options for a school at Mueller during 2014, something they will continue to investigate. Infrastructure to the east of Berkman was built this year and the first Mueller homes in the Blanton attendance zone are now under construction. Breaking ground in January and opening in October, the Sally & Mack Brown Rise School of Austin in Rathgeber Village, a part of Windsor Park but south of 51st, provides high quality early childhood education to children with developmental disabilities and to children without

disabilities to provide an integrated learning environment. The AISD Performing Arts Center and its parking garage appeared this year, with grand-opening events planned for January  $22^{nd} - 24^{th}$ .

An amendment to Mueller's Planned Unit Development (PUD) is anticipated early in 2015. More information will be forthcoming on that in the new-year.

Council Member Kathie Tovo's RMMAPIAC(Mueller Commission) appointee Jerry Perkins passed away in July. She recently appointed Mueller resident Dennis Mick to the Commission. Terms for all City of Austin Board & Commission members expires in July of 2015. Visit the City Clerk's website for an online application if you are interested in serving.


