Meet Your Neighbor - Candace Hunter

Our neighbor on Briarcliff was elected to the Austin School Board in 2022 and is on a mission: make sure teachers, students and families have a voice in AISD.

A history teacher in Austin from 1997 to 2015 at Webb, Pearce, and Sadler-Means, Candace and husband Victor have raised their children John-Mark and Hezekiah in Windsor Park since 2010. Candace currently works in teacher certification at ACC. Membership of the school board is a volunteer position.

Candace and the WPNA school committee organized a public feedback event at our August neighborhood meeting which included At Large board members Arati Singh and Fernando Lucas de Urioste along with neighbors from Pecan Springs and University Hills. Results from our event will go to the school district office for consideration.

Such meetings go against the wishes of the Texas Education Agency. "The State of Texas does not want school board members to do outreach, to visit schools, to have community meetings and listen to parents and students. There's a whole organization called TASB that sets the rules for board members and all of it is geared to almost rubber stamp the superintendent and stifle independent thought."

The recent Texas legislative session created a massive number of new laws for school districts. One of the immediate policy issues is eliminating student cell phones, . Another more controversial law regards trans students. "We can no longer socially transition a student. That means we can't use their pronouns or their transition name. If Mario wants to be called Maria, a teacher can lose their job using the new name."

There are also new rules for the School Board members. "We have I think 107 things we have to do, and go down the list and check them off. We have a board coach that was brought in by the TEA called Lone Star Governance. You will see during the meeting board members receiving a text that's telling us we are not asking the right kinds of questions."

Board members are limited in the most significant way: the superintendent is the only employee they can communicate with directly. "If I see something wrong, I can't technically address it. I have to go to the superintendent, and he then finds someone. It can take months to get something done."

But there is good news.
"At the heart of why we show up to work every day is for our students.
We have some amazing young people doing some



amazing things. We have kids in LASA that are in peer-reviewed journals." Candace brags about LBJ High and its important programs in medicine and firefighting. "They have a medical training suite that is like a hospital."

Candace will host more events this school year at several District 1 campuses to continue her mission to make Austin schools better for teachers and students.

Harris Elementary - an update



Yard of the Month - 1301 Berkshire Drive

The September 2025 winners are Michael Guzman and Arturo Longoria. They have lived at 1301 Berkshire Drive for six years. Since both Michael and Arturo grew up with parents who had green thumbs, they grew up loving gardens and gardening. They were also inspired by their neighbors' yards, the Wildflower Center, and the TV program, Central Texas Gardener.

They wanted a xeric landscape that was showy and would attract pollinators. They have a patch of grass surrounded by mulched flower beds. Though many of their plants require little or no water, Michael and Arturo have a water barrel. A rain chain directs water from their roof to the barrel.

Their plants include Agave, Texas Betony,
Esperanza, Native Milkweed, Hibiscus, Fall Astors,
Yucca, Purple and White Trailing Lantanas, Copper Canyon
Daisies, Butterfly Bush, Cannas and White Mistflower. They also
have several sages including Mexican Bush, Mountain, Autumn,
Mealy Blue, and Jerusalem. Most are true Salvias. They inherited
two Crape Myrtles and a Bur Oak. Their Fig Tree looks much
younger. A Ligustrum hedge along the Cameron Road side of
their property lessens noise and gives them some privacy.

Now they have birds, bees, butterflies and moths, and other insects in their front yard. They also have lizards running around their yard. They and their inside cats enjoy the show.



Michael and Arturo will receive a \$50.00 gift certificate from Shoal Creek Nursery on Hancock Drive. It has great collections of plants, seeds, pots, and garden paraphernalia including gloves in various sizes.. While you are there be sure to greet their cats and admire the waterfall.

A Little Light Rewilding, part 2

Continuing my article from last month, see below my last few tips for rewilding and encouraging wildlife to thrive in our yards.

5 Mulberries

A few years ago, I planted a native red mulberry and last year added another. It is the plant that has attracted the most species by itself. This year it reeled in a resident cat bird during the fruiting season, Baltimore orioles kept coming back for more, and even some titmouse that were carrying away whole berries.

6 Feeding the Birds and Putting up Nest Boxes

I put up a few nest boxes, although I have only had Carolina wrens take advantage so far. The feeders, however, are a different story, and there has been a huge range of birds taking advantage of the different food I put out. I hang the feeders from invisible wire, which is too thin for the squirrels to navigate and make sure the feeders are 6 feet off the ground and 8 feet from buildings and trees that the squirrels might use as launching pads - it works!

7 Valuing the Big Trees

I appreciate and value the big trees that are in our neighbors' yards around the property. Yes, they drop leaves and pollen, and sometimes the seedlings seem never ending, but the payoffs are huge: shade, habitat, different food sources. We have had 6 different woodpecker species through, 3 or 4 almost daily, and on top of that the occasional nuthatch.

If you are looking to do a little rewilding in your yard or even want to create a multi-purpose space with some space for nature, the seven things above are the things that worked for me the best in this location. Good luck and feel free to get in touch if you would like to chat any of this through. Let's make University Hills and Windsor Park a maze of wildlife corridors and battle the concrete!
