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Letter from the President - Why Civic Engagement?

"Civic participation over a lifetime, working in neighborhoods and communities and service of all kinds - military and civilian, full-time and part-time, national and international - will strengthen America's civic purpose." -- John McCain

Within the first month of moving into our our home in Windsor Park, I received the Window on Windsor, and I knew I had moved into the right community. A community with neighbors who volunteer their time to write, edit, and publish this newsletter, and then walk the streets hand delivering it indicated to me that this is a neighborhood with a deep sense of civic engagement.

My husband and I didn't want to live in an HOA community, with a board policing the colors of doors and the height of the grass. We have our challenges in this community for sure, and conflicts or disagreements from time to time, but I think the biggest marker of the ethic of this community is that we work together to solve problems democratically. This community is the hallmark of what civic engagement means to me.

I write this article thinking ahead to the upcoming primary election. Dan Strub, our Vice President, is spearheading an effort with other nearby neighborhoods (Mueller, Agave, J.J. Seabrook, and Pecan Springs) to organize a candidate forum for Texas House District 46, the seat currently occupied by Rep. Dawnna Dukes. We have invited both Democratic and Republican candidates to participate ahead of the primary election on March 6. As you all well know, the primary election in this district is very important, and often even has greater importance than the general election. So this will be a fantastic opportunity to get to know more about the candidates running for this key position.

Windsor Park Library Closed for Renovations Starting January 19, 2018

The Windsor Park branch of the Austin Public Library, at 5833 Westminster Dr., will be closed starting Friday, January 19, 2018 for a complete renovation. *La biblioteca cerrara por renovaciones de seis meses comenzando el viernes, 19 de enero.*

The renovation work, expected to take six months, will include:

- Technology upgrades
- Plumbing retrofits and HVAC (heating, ventilation, and air conditioning) improvements
- Improved interior layout and replacement of flooring and other interior finishes
- Replacement of all worn furniture, fixtures, and equipment

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


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UPDATE FROM COUNCIL MEMBER HOUSTON

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February 2018 Mueller Update

Quack's 43rd Street Bakery saw an opportunity to open its third Austin shop when Bribery Bakery closed its Mueller location back in September. Called Lady Quackenbush's Cakery, the company will move the cake production shop from 43rd Street into Suite 300 of 1900 Simond Avenue, across from Lake Park, and is expected to open in early 2018.

Lady Quackenbush will make use of Bribery's liquor license to serve beer and wine, as well as coffee and espresso. The bakery will also offer pastries, cookies, customized cakes and truffles.

Colleen's Kitchen, at 1911 Aldrich Street on the McBee corner of the Alamo Drafthouse building, had its soft opening the second week of January, and should be fully operational by February. The restaurant is owned and operated by Mueller residents Ashley and Sean Fric, who wanted to channel the spirit, and recipes, of a favorite aunt. Customers have posted rave reviews about the service, cocktails, and southern food, like chicken and buttermilk biscuits.

Check the Mueller Austin Facebook page for events planned for 2018, like the KUTX Concert Series and the new Wednesday Night Live tradition, which is an Aldrich Street event happening the second Wednesday of each month.

When the IH-35 frontage road striping that leads drivers onto Barbara Jordan Blvd. was put in by TXDOT 10 years ago it caused confusion and drew complaints. The recent re-striping of the area is more logical and should lead to smoother traffic flow. Other transportation improvements at Mueller include the late spring completion of Zach Scott Street's connection to Manor Road, where sidewalk and trail improvements will also occur. Then later in the year, the connection of Tilley Street to 51st Street just east of the reclaimed water tower will be complete. The Austin Transportation Department is also applying to the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization, who parcel out federal transportation dollars to six central Texas counties, for funding that may allow construction this year for the 51st Street Vision Plan (now called the 51st Street Mobility Project). WPNA, the Mueller Neighborhood Association, and RMMAPIAC all sent correspondence in support of the funding. Updates on

the project are available at www.austintexas.gov/department/e-51st-street-mobility-project.

The Robert Mueller Municipal Airport Plan Implementation Advisory Commission will meet on Tuesday February 13, at 6 pm at the Britton, Durst, Howard & Spence Building (Chestnut Community Center) at 1183 Chestnut Avenue RMMAPIAC agendas, minutes and other documents are available at https://austintexas.gov/rmmapiac.




Candidate Forum: Stay informed, get engaged! Dan Strub

Do you want to know what the Texas Legislature can do for you? Want to get engaged before the March 6 primary? Come talk to the candidates running to represent you. The WPNA, working with several other neighborhood associations, is hosting a candidate forum for Texas House District 46.

The Texas House District seat is currently held by Dawnna Dukes, and she is being challenged by Warren Baker, Sheryl Cole, Ana Cortez, Casey McKinney, and Chito Vela for the Democratic nomination. Gabriel Nila is running for the Republican nomination.

All candidates have been invited and the forum is open to all. Audience members will be given a chance to ask questions of the candidates.

February 2018 Yard of the Month

The February 2018 yard belongs to John Vinson and Martha Vogel at 1803 Ridgemont Drive. Throughout the year their yard welcomes wildlife ranging from bees and butterflies to anoles and toads. John and Martha have gotten ideas from the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center and local nurseries, as well as their neighbors.

They have lived on Ridgemont for 17 years, during which time their yard has gone through several changes. Losing their big elm tree to drought forced them to plant more sun-loving annuals and perennials. On the other hand, their oak tree has continued to grow causing them to add more shade-loving plants. The yard is sectioned off using low rock fences. Swales or trenches give the landscape still more interest and also help control water.


Their trees and shrubs include Mountain Laurel, Eve's Necklace, Bamboo Muhly, Nolina, Mazari Palm, Mexican Fan Palm, Red Oak, Live Oak, Dwarf Bamboo, and a Peach tree. They also have Dwarf Yaupon Holly, Cenizo, Palmetto, Pigeonberry, native Sedges, Bicolor Iris, Twistleaf Yucca, Red Yucca, Camellia, Agave Parryi, Squid Agave, and Rosemary.

Depending on the weather in February their several types of salvia, Turk's Cap, and lantanas may be blooming.

They save water by using low-water plants, mulching, and harvesting rain water. On the north side of the front of the house they have a cistern. It is light blue to go with the blue painted brick. Martha and John are both avid gardeners, who work in the yard all year. Much of their front yard is mulched with crushed granite. Since weeds like to grow in granite, they find that they spend much of their work time pulling weeds. I assume that much of the time they spend in their yard is fun, but weeding is work!

President's Letter from page 1, Why Civic Engagement?

Here's what I dug up for the last primary and general elections in 2016:

Ballots cast in Windsor Park precincts	36.8%	59%
118, 130, 133, 135, 142		
Ballots cast in all of Travis County	36.9%	65%

We can draw the following conclusions: Although the primary election often plays a bigger role in the outcome of the general election, we are not giving it the attention it deserves. Our voter turnout for a presidential election is lower than Travis County's as a whole. Turnout is usually even lower during midterm elections.

Politicians pay attention to votes. Let's make the politicians sit up and take notice in this election. This primary for district 46 matters to our community. The Texas Legislature makes key decisions that affect everything from education to law enforcement to bathroom bills. In many ways, the decisions made by the state legislature will have a broader, more meaningful impact on our daily lives than decisions made at the national level.

This is my call to action: Participate in our candidate forum (more information on page 4) on February 15 at the Memorial United Methodist Church. Vote on or before March 6. Then talk to your neighbors and remind them to go vote as well. We have two goals - push our voter participation higher than Travis County's, and surpass our voter turnout from the March 2016 election.

I believe we can do it and show all of Austin our neighborhood's commitment to lifelong civic engagement!
