At our February WPNA meeting we went virtual again – my sincere apologies for any confusion regarding the last-minute pivot. We are hoping to move forward with the in-person/hybrid for our next meeting, but please stay tuned to our Facebook, website, and emails/listserv for updates. We'll be assessing the local situation and making our call at our Executive Committee meetings (about 2 weeks before the monthly meeting).

In case you missed the meeting, we had two guest speakers share about new resources in Windsor Park: 1) Texas Children's Hospital- Windsor Park Clinic, who came especially to our diverse neighborhood to provide resources for families in need and is supporting the community in more ways than one (thank you for becoming an annual Newsletter Sponsor!) & 2) Ridwell – which is a company working to reduce waste and provide convenience with a household pickup service for reusable and hard to recycle items.

We also heard from our WPNA Committees, and members voted to approve our Audit Committee volunteers for this year (thank you Alana Carpenter-Moore, Sheryl Cheatham, and Cam Russe). Members also voted to approve an ad-hoc committee for 2022: Communications Committee-which will focus on WPNA marketing and communication; especially in time with the 40-year anniversary of WPNA. This committee seeks to provide a broader understanding of the benefits the WPNA brings to our neighborhood. Thank you Miranda Molen, for volunteering to Chair this committee.

The ad-hoc committee is already at work, as we celebrated a recap of WPNA accomplishments from the 40 years in 40 days campaign. 

Back into the Spring Swing

After a little bit of a slowdown this past fall, the spring market is back in full swing. We're seeing more offers, higher over asking price, and LOTS of investors. I feel like a bit of a broken record, but what's driving our market is low inventory, higher costs to build, and population growth (everyone wants to move to Austin these days). Some are predicting that with interest rates going up, this will pass. While I think rising rates will have an impact, I'm seeing so many people putting 20-50% down, that I don't expect it to have a major swing. A 1% rate increase could mean an additional \$200-\$300/mo in payments. So if you were thinking about moving, I would try to do it before rates go up any more.

Perhaps, like me, you've noticed and wondered about the cinder-block wall painted with an ocean wave on Berkman Drive at Chapman Street. Behind that wall is an unassuming house, and inside that house is a . . . drum roll please . . . cooking school. Let's Eat Austin is owned and operated by three easy-going and creative friends who love each other and share a passion for all things culinary.

Chefs Aaron and Megan met in culinary school where they were each turning toward their true passions after burning out in their first careers – Aaron as a chemical engineer in the corporate world, Megan as a religious scholar working in a bookstore. The two were drawn to each other's over-the-top enthusiasm and dedication to culinary excellence. After culinary school they met Whitney, a photographer, videographer, and award-winning cocktail creator whose quirky and collaborative personality was a perfect fit and the three began cooking up plans for a shared entrepreneurial venture.

The school opened in 2017 with a few cooking and cocktail classes in the home of Aaron and his husband, John Paul. Aaron built a garden and started raising chickens. Soon, the school was taking over their home, so just before the pandemic hit, the couple bought a house across the street and fully dedicated the corner house to the cooking school. (John Paul, a realtor in the neighborhood has deep roots in Windsor Park. His grandmother lived here. His parents met here and were in the first graduating class at Reagan High.)

Though they clearly take their craft and their business seriously, the three friends agree that their number-one priority is having fun. That attitude has helped them to build and grow their business through the challenges of the pandemic. And their infectious, fun-loving personalities have surely helped build their clientele. One of their favorite parts of

teaching is watching people of all ages and walks of life come together and get to know each other over the stove or cutting board. By the end of many classes people are exchanging phone numbers and making future plans together. Another gratifying experience is seeing people light up after learning the proper way to chop an onion. And speaking of fun, every year on Halloween day, Let's Eat Austin hosts an open house with themed treats and Halloween photo ops in their "spooky garden". This year on April 23rd, they are excited to bring the community together with a Spring Fling Garden Party. Megan is envisioning flowers everywhere including edible ones to garnish the pastries.

March 2022 Mueller Update

Not only has Austin Modern Lofts broken ground at 51st and Mueller Blvd. for it's 39-unit + first-floor retail project that will "wrap" the AISD PAC parking garage, they've also got a 90-unit project underway at Berkman & Tom Mueller. And just across Berkman, Ryan Companies has started a 345-unit apartment project adjacent to the Mueller Tower. AMLI has a total of 732 units underway, 326 at Aldrich & Garcia, and 406 between Mattie & Aldrich, which will have retail space fronting Aldrich. Pearlstone Partner's 6-story, 200unit Parkside condos project that includes 8 for-sale ground-floor commercial spaces is underway at Aldrich & Mueller Boulevard.



Across Simond Avenue from Parkside, the

"Bravo" building and its garage will soon rise next to its "Alpha" sibling. These two buildings will house the Teacher Retirement System of Texas offices, and provide additional public parking for the Aldrich district's eateries and entertainment.

The next Robert Mueller Municipal Airport Plan Implementation Advisory Commission meeting is Tuesday, March 8th at 6PM to be held at Austin Energy Headquarters, 4815 Mueller Blvd. Please utilize the parking garage entrance off Garcia Street. 
The Northeast Raider varsity basketball team clinched a playoff berth into the UIL Class 5A bracket.

March 2022 - Meet Your Historic Neighbor - Alice Jenkins

In this 40th year of being a neighborhood organization, I am spotlighting past members of WPNA and today I write about one whose name can be found in the WP branch library.

Alice and Paul Jenkins moved to Windsor Park, along with their daughters Kathryn and Jill, in the late 1950's from London, after being stationed at Bergstrom Air Force Base. Windsor Park had many Air Force residents in those days. At first the Jenkins lived on Berkshire, but then moved to a house on Northridge in 1965 that would one day connect with the library of the future.

Daughter Jill says they were original members of the Windsor Park Presbyterian Church, and in fact helped to build it. Today this is the Mennonite Church next to the


library. The first decade of WPNA meetings took place in this church.

Jill remembers visiting the book mobile with her mother and sister in the parking lot of Windsor Village. Jill says her mother also volunteered at Harris Elementary school library, which eventually lead to Alice getting a Master's Degree in Library Science at UT. Alice worked for Materials Resources with AISD libraries.

I found Alice and Paul on the original typewritten WPNA member list from 1982, and Alice was on the first Library Committee in 1983. "Building a permanent branch library was the original organizing principal of the association" said then-president Stephen Rodi. Over the years Alice made many appeals to the city council regarding the library, and was a helpful organizer with WPNA candidate forums. Along with the help of Rodi, who was on the city's library commission, the long term efforts of Alice Jenkins and the library committee finally paid off, and in 2000 the city built our branch library within view of Alice's back yard! It only took 18 years.

Alice passed in 2009, but lived to see the Alice Jenkins Conference Room, which is where the WPNA executive committee would meet before Covid. When asked for an Alice story, Stephen Rodi said he didn't have any stories, just that Alice "moved along sensibly." That is the modus operandi of WPNA in my opinion, and the reason we have so many successes.
