What a joy it was to see your smiling faces again at our March WPNA meeting last month! After two long years of being fully virtual, we had our first attempt at a hybrid meeting- where we met in person and also streamed the meeting live (virtually). There were a few bumps, including some delays and technical challenges, but it was a grand effort by some pioneering and optimistic Windsor Parkers. The guest speakers were both informative and inspiring. We had donuts and coffee to fuel the conversations around some very important topics. And the fact that we could do it TOGETHER is what I would consider SUCCESS, my friends. Thank you to all who joined and helped make this happen!

I also want to thank our host, Memorial United Methodist Church (MUMC), for their longstanding relationship and continued support. WPNA monthly meetings have been held at MUMC for many years in the smaller room adjacent to the gym. Following some great suggestions from neighbors to bring back in-person meetings as safely as possible, we coordinated with the church to see if we could move our meetings into the gym. We had met in the gym in March 2020, and knew it would have the space needed to spread out and properly distance. WPNA members also voted to amend the budget to increase our donation from \$300 to \$600 annually to MUMC to offer our support and offset costs associated with the change in venue space. We are grateful that this increase in the budget for 2022 was fully covered by a small business donation.

The room may not be quite as cozy as it felt in the past, now with more room to spread out, but I still felt the "community togetherness" and an energy that was contagious at our last meeting. Especially during the presentation about the I-35 Capital Express Central project, which took a deeper dive into latest plans and prompted great questions from the audience. The lively discussion surfaced so much feedback, that the I-35 team saw value in continuing the conversation directly with Windsor Park in a follow-up meeting. We will coordinate with our Transportation Committee to set this up, and keep you posted on the details to join.

After the I-35 presentation and conversation, Dr. Rodi dusted off his WPNA President's hat from 1982 to offer some initial observations on the impact of this project on Windsor Park. He followed with, "So it sounds like life today is not that much different than it was in 1982, it's just a different and much grander collection of problems that the neighborhood is dealing with and will be affected by." Cheers, Dr. Rodi – you have inspired a long line of Presidents and engaged neighbors that continue the work you helped start 40 years ago. Please put it on your calendars to join us every second Saturday at 10am for our monthly meetings- where we talk about the things impacting our neighborhood!

Also, spring is here! It's time to get outside with the dancing butterflies and sunshine. We have a great opportunity after our April 9<sup>th</sup> WPNA meeting to get together at Bartholomew Park for a creek clean-up to support our scholarships. The event is in partnership with Keep Austin Beautiful and our scheduled time has been extended from 11am-1pm so that you can attend the meeting and join at the park after!

#### Climate Corner – Methane Madness or Methane Progress

#### Forest tent caterpillars

Forest tent caterpillars cause damage in the larval, or caterpillar, stage. Caterpillars are a greyish- brown color with bright blue and yellow stripes running down the sides of their body. The back of the caterpillar has white shoeprint/ keyhole markings. Larvae also have fine white hairs over their body but are not a stinging caterpillar.



These caterpillars, although called tent caterpillars, do not make an actual tent like others in their group. Other tent caterpillars make a web between two branches where they join or split from each other. Forest tent caterpillars make a silken mat on the tree trunk or large branches where caterpillars gather in groups between feedings.

Forest tent caterpillars appear once a year, typically in April. In some years outbreak populations can occur and numerous caterpillars can be seen in certain areas. They chew foliage of trees, usually deciduous hardwoods. Even though the caterpillars eat foliage, many trees can withstand 20% loss of foliage without being harmed. Concern should be when other stressors are apparent along with the caterpillars, such as drought or disease.

If the need to manage forest tent caterpillars occurs, less toxic active ingredients that can be used to treat foliage are Bacillus thuringiensis (Bt) kurstaki or spinosad. Another option would be to treat the silken mat with a pyrethroid product when the caterpillars are resting there.

#### April 2022 Mueller Update

KUTX will rock the amphitheater at Mueller Lake Park again this spring and summer with a new set of free, family-friendly Friday concerts. Apologies for not getting this out sooner, as the first was March 25<sup>th</sup> — concerts will also be held on April 8<sup>th</sup>, May 13<sup>th</sup> and June 3<sup>rd</sup>. Starting with a kid-oriented set around 6:30, the grownups get a set at 7:30. Come a bit early to secure your spot on the lawn (blankets are okay, chairs aren't) and grab your dinner from a food truck. There will be coloring for the kids at the Mueller tent, additional activities from our sponsors, and cold beverages for the grown-ups. Barring the unlikely occurrence of some huge calamity (and hey, we've mostly made it through a major pandemic), the Mueller Master Developer Agreement between the City of Austin and Catellus calls for the public-private partnership between the two entities to end on December 2, 2024, now less than two years away. Other than the UT Medical/Research block bound by E. 51st Street, Lancaster Drive, Barbara Jordan and Mueller Boulevards, it is quite possible the project will be in the final phases of its initial build-out by that time. The Mueller Commission, the City of Austin, Catellus, the Mueller Property Owner's Association, Mueller Neighborhood Association, and residents in and around Mueller all have concerns about how Mueller will transition. I'll be covering those issues as we start winding down twenty-plus years of Mueller Updates!

The next Robert Mueller Municipal Airport Plan Implementation Advisory Commission meeting is Tuesday, April 12<sup>th</sup> at 6PM to be held at Austin Energy Headquarters, 4815 Mueller Blvd. Please utilize the parking garage entrance off Garcia Street. #### April 2022 Yard of the Month – 1311 Berkshire Drive

Sometimes we choose a vegetable garden as Yard of the Month. This is one of those times. Jane Churchill and her husband, Brian Graham, grow both vegetables and flowers in their front yard. They have lived at 1311 Berkshire Drive since 1983 and are members of WPNA.

Brian and Jane get many ideas from the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center and "**Grow Green**" published by Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service and the City of Austin. It is free at some independent nurseries; Jane considers it a bible. Jane also advises visiting Zilker Park and Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center – and, of course, observe what grows well in your neighbors' yards.

When I visited them, they had a utility room full of tomato plants that were waiting to plant. By the time you read this, they will have three raised beds each of tomatoes, peppers, and eggplants. They also have herbs galore including two beds of basil, one for the kitchen and one for the bees. They use soaker hoses to water their beds. Their Salvias include both culinary and ornamental. Other plants in their yard include Bay Laurel, Bush Germander, Carolina Jessamine, Rosemary, Globe Mallow, Roses, Flame Acanthus, Coralberry, Rock Rose, Chile Pequin, Copper Canyon Daisy. Mexican Mint Marigold, Plumbago, and Yellow Bells (Esperanza), some Agaves, Red Yucca, Pride of Barbados, Gulf Muhly, Purple Fountain Grass, and Catnip for their six cats.

Jane and Brian will get a \$50.00 gift certificate from Shoal Creek Nursery – which is wonderful to visit with a great variety of plants and garden enhancements, and very helpful employees.

Do not be shy – we need nominations! If you like a certain yard, or more than one, tell us. We may not have seen your yard, or your neighbor's yard. Parks and Recreation and Watershed Protection are apparently in the process of making big changes through the Park at Tilley and E 51st. Waterloo Disc Golf has been working with them to re-route and restore the disc golf course. They have also discussed with Safe Routes to School a safe bikeway through Bartholomew to Blanton that would link WP with the new Northeast Middle School and beyond. Windsor Park has talked about this for several years, but we hope there will be some community outreach and solicitation of community input to implement the vision as the new middle school plans to open in fall, 2023.

**Pomerleau Pocket Park:** No up-dates. Previously published and funded Phase 1 start date has been pushed back indefinitely from January 2022 because of many code issues that needed to be addressed prior to approval of Planning Commission and City Council. Recently we heard that when Parks and Recreation acquired the land 8 years ago, they did not request a zoning change from single family residence to park land. WPNCT should be the one to sign off on this and has requested a meeting with PARD prior to going to Council.

**Windsor Village redevelopment.** Limited parkland 1.5 acres, bisected by a Westminster Drive entrance to multistory dwellings, planned and close to approval.

**Neighborhood Mobility Connections:** WPNA is developing a graphic of our vision for two north-south bikeways east and west of Berkman. The Belfast Hike and Bike Trail that crosses Tannehill Branch Creek at Broadmoor and crosses a right of way to Mueller. The Westminster Hike and Bike Trail would connect Pomerleau Park at the north end, pass Harris and Blanton elementary schools, turn on to Greenbrook, then through Bartholomew Park to link to the Tilley Street bikeway and the new Northeast Middle School.
