The Climate Committee has several programs on tap for this month. First up will be at the WPNA monthly meeting, Saturday May 13 where the Climate Committee will have a speaker.

On Wednesday May 31 we will host Congressman Lloyd Doggett's Senior Policy Advisor Mark Rickling on the Windsor Park Climate Conversation regarding all the federal rebates available to homeowners through the Inflation Reduction Act. Among many items, this includes \$800 to switch your water heater from natural gas to electric. We will also be joined by an Austin Energy representative to discuss local programs and rebates. Tune in to find out what you can do to help reduce your carbon footprint in your own house.

On Saturday June 3 the Committee will give away an Electric Lawnmower and Electric Edger/trimmer at our first ever Eco Extravaganza. Congressman Doggett's Austin Staff Assistant will be available to answer questions about federal rebates available to homeowners. A representative from Austin Energy will be there to help with local rebates. Several local climate change organizations will table the event, including Citizen's Climate Lobby and the Sierra Club. This is your opportunity to see a house with solar panel system up close and learn how it works. Committee member Selwyn Polit is hosting the event at 5512 Coventry Lane from 11am to 1pm.

The Climate Committee is dedicated to helping Windsor Park residents take action. We have done a great deal of research the past four years and we believe the answer is to personally stop using fossil fuels as an energy source. We believe the best way to achieve that is electrifying our homes and transportation as soon as possible and switching to renewable energy sources. We recommend switching to the Green Choice renewable program at Austin Energy as a first step, and today there are lots of rebate dollars available to take other actions. And a free lawnmower! Look for our signs around the neighborhood.



May 2023 Mueller Update Rick Krivoniak

Principal Jordan Benson of Marshall Middle School spoke at the April Mueller Commission. She's busy preparing for the first class of 260 sixth-graders who will start school on August 14th. AISD busing policy provides rides to those living more than two miles from the school, so Windsor Parkers living west of Cameron Road, or north of an arc from Larkwood at Cameron to roughly Briarcliff at Berkman, and those north of Wheless Lane may qualify. Parks Update – May 2023 Jeanette Swenson

Pomerleau Pocket Park's projected May opening date has likely been postponed according to Katie Robillard at Austin Parks Foundation. APF and PARD are waiting for a water meter / tap permit and trade permit for irrigation from the City of Austin. Meanwhile, the park is taking shape and WPNA is working with Austin Transportation Department to install a safer crossing at Berkman and Patton Lane.

Jen Wong, assisted by Jennifer Murray-Chavez and Guadeloupe Abbud, led a successful Tannehill Branch Clean-up in Bartholomew Park on April 8. Forty volunteers gathered forty plus bags of trash and 5 bags of recyclable cans and bottles. More trash was picked up for the Earth Day clean-up on April 22, led by Guadalupe Abbud and WPNA.

We have prioritized a safe pedestrian crossing through Bartholomew Park to Tilley Street and the new Marshall Middle School, opening in August 2023. Austin Parks and Recreation, Watershed Protection and WPNA stakeholders met and pointed out areas of concern including an open space adjacent to the north side of the creek; a completed trail around the park, safer connection across the pool parking lot; erosion points on the north side of the creek; the soccer field / dog park location and re-configuration; restoration of 18 hole disc golf course; and integration of the Watershed Protection mitigation project with the proposed through the park trail. There are a lot of moving pieces!

To address the under programming at Bartholomew Park, Austin Parks Foundation has designated and publicized a play-date in the parks for Bartholomew. Hopefully, it will be publicized earlier as notification of the first two coincided with the release date. 

Update on Windsor Village Development

Transwestern Development presented a proposed site plan for their Phase II redevelopment of Windsor Village at February's Windsor Park Contact Team meeting. They have also applied

to the City of Austin for a site plan permit, which indicates there will be 296 apartments, 9,995 square feet of retail space facing Berkman, and 3,000 square feet of commercial space (likely to be about 4 or 5 live-work units) facing Westminster.



Yard of the Month - 1501 Corona Drive Sara Jane Lee

The May winners are Leticia Reveles, Thom McFarland, and their son Avery of 1501 Corona Drive. Thom and Leticia have lived there for twenty-five years, Avery for considerably less.

They have two small vegetable plots in their front yard. Flowers, especially Red Poppies, and some herbs are scattered over the remaining yard. These plots include Cilantro, Garlic, Peppermint, Thyme, Chives, Kale, Onions, Parsley, and various Sages. There is more Cilantro outside the garden plots than inside them. Leticia describes it quite accurately as a forest of Cilantro. They also have Indian Blanket, Texas Lantana, pink Roses, red Roses, pink and red Penstemons, and a blue Salvia. Many of the plants attract polinators.

They have many shrubs and small trees such as Pomegranate Bush, Euonymus and several small trees. The trees include two Crape Myrtles, an Oak, a Viburnum, a Peach, a Plum, a Mulberry, a Mountain Laurel, and a Cherry Laurel. There are enough small trees that I worry I may have missed some! Leticia and Thom have been working on their yard for years. It is a constantly changing project and the result of trying plants and seeing which ones thrive. Many are perennials or annuals that reseed themselves year after year. Much of the yard is part of Avery's playground. Thom and Leticia will receive a \$50.00 gift certificate from Shoal Creek Nursery. While you are there be sure to greet Chicago and admire the waterfall.

Do not be shy. If you like a certain yard, or more than one, tell us. We cannot visit every yard in the neighborhood each month. We may not have seen your yard, or your neighbor's yard.
