Investing in our future Funding record scholarships and SOS! (Save our Shopping Center)

The WPNA is embarking upon a journey into uncharted territory in 2 big ways—

- By supporting an appeal of the administrative site plan approval at Windsor Village (going where no appeal in Austin, to our knowledge, has gone before VMU)
- 2) And funding another record number of deserving scholarships this year: 20! (which we look forward to celebrating on June 11th at our next monthly meeting)

I am proud of how much Windsor Parkers care about our future, and are putting their full support behind it (no matter the challenge).

S.O.S – Save our Shopping Center!

The Windsor Village working group has been "all hands on deck" since we received notice of the administrative site plan approval on May 2, 2022 for the redevelopment of a portion of our historic neighborhood shopping center. The news came as a bit of a surprise after the City's project website had listed the project as expired for several days, which prompted the group to check in on the status. The working group has been researching and following the project since 2020, and recently began preparing for a potential appeal by verifying requirements with City departments and the Board of Adjustment (BOA) liaison. An appeal to the Board of Adjustment is currently the only option to challenge the interpretations an administrative site plan approval. of

It was a sprint following a marathon, and some last minute hurdles – including a change in appeal eligibility requirements (that is nowhere to be found in the Land Development Code, of which was extensively researched in preparation). City Staff communicated



the update via email, referencing a state statute that further narrowed the interested party eligibility to within 200' of the project site, and that a neighborhood organization was no longer eligible. We sought guidance from our Council Member, Chito Vela, whose team helped us navigate the confusion and support our next steps.

Based on our understanding of the new requirements, we learned that we could place our support behind the Austin Mennonite Church, represented by Larry Abraham, which (with the support of many in our neighborhood) has filed an Interpretation Appeal of the administrative site plan approval at Windsor Village.

Supporting the Appeal

Both the WPNA and WPNPCT (Windsor Park Contact Team) provided a letter of support for the appeal. The Windsor Village working group pulled together an extensive outline of supporting documentation that highlights the compliance concerns for the BOA to consider. CM Vela and Conor Kenny connected the team with Stuart Hersh, who has generously volunteered to share his extensive expertise and act as a consulting agent for the appeal, pro bono.

WPNA members voted at the May meeting to expand their support to cover the appeal fee up front so that there was some flexibility in the fundraising to meet the tight deadline. CM Vela's office is also pursuing a fee waiver to reimburse the appeal fee (which will go through City Council Approval processes).

We don't know how the appeal will ultimately turn out in the end, though we are hopeful, and have taken seriously the responsibility to advocate for a project that fully complies with the applicable requirements. Our efforts today stand by the hard work of all neighbors who took part in the neighborhood planning process to ensure the Windsor Village Shopping Center would remain a Neighborhood Urban Center with a wide range of commercial uses.

The resilience and resolve of our neighborhood is sometimes tested, and in these moments, I am so grateful to be surrounded by neighbors that give a darn, and channel that passion through partnership and purpose.




Youtube program Wednesday June 22 at 7pm.

June 2022 Yard of the Month – 5204 Knight Circle

Dorothy Mandell and Rouke Mulder of 5204 Knight Circle are the June winners. While it was not an "official" nomination, the yard was mentioned in a conversation with a neighbor.

Rouke and Dorothy were inspired by walks around Windsor Park. Also, they use "Grow Green," a free local publication, as a plant guide. They have plants blooming from spring through fall and attracting many butterflies, humming birds, and bees.

These plants include Artemisia Texas Lantana, Jerusalem Sage, Missouri Primrose, Texas Sage, Mexican Bush Sage, Esperanza, Creeping Germander, Santolina, two new Mexican Sycamore trees, Crape Myrtles, and Wax Myrtles. The Missouri Primrose is one of their favorites because in the spring its beautiful yellow flowers attract pollinators. Later in the year the Mexican Bush Sage keeps the butterflies and the bees happy.

Dorothy and Rouke have a neat, compact yard much of it consisting of mulched beds nesting in a rectangular rockscape. When Dorothy and Rouke moved to Knight Circle seven years ago, they started working on their yard. Two years ago they lost a large tree. They had to radically change their plants because areas that had been shady were now sunny. Since their plants

are native or adapted to the Austin climate, they only have to water in extremely hot weather with exceptions for new plants like the Sycamore trees. They built a French drain to move water from the house to the mulched beds. Weeding takes most of their time.

Dorothy and Rouke will get a \$50.00 gift certificate from Shoal Creek Nursery. Their employees are helpful and friendly. It is a pleasure to visit and they have "Grow Green."

Mueller Update

The Master Developer Agreement between Catellus and the City of Austin expires in December of 2024. Brian Dolezal of Catellus gave a brief update on that coming transition, though it's possible a short extension could be granted should the need arise. All interested parties are working to make that transition smooth and to ensure that Mueller's Property Owner's Association will be in a strong financial state as it takes over many of the operations and events from Catellus.

Just off of Manor Road at Zach Scott Street, the Southeast Greenway's skatepark plaza and pump track should be completed by this fall. Pump tracks were originally created for mountain bike/ BMXers as a circuit of banked turns and features designed to be ridden by generating momentum with up and down body movements instead of pedaling or pushing. Pump Tracks are also used by skateboarders and accessible to wheelchair users.

The Origin Hotel, just across the Paseo from BD Riley's, hopes to be open by mid-June.



Kern's flower beetles

Kern's flower beetles are a type of scarab beetle, closely related to May and June beetles. These are medium sized beetles, reaching about 1/3 inch in length. There are multiple color variations ranging from all black, to brownish-orange or creamy white with black markings.

These beetles are pollen feeders and can be found in multiple types of flowers. Often you will find numerous beetles in a single flower. Treatment of these beetles is optional as they feed on pollen and typically do not eat the flower itself. If you feel the need to remove the beetles, you can hand pick them and dump them into a bucket of soapy water.
