After a follow-up conversation about the I-35 project with TxDOT, we also provided an update for the Windsor Village Appeal at the June meeting. Please watch the meeting video replay on our website (windsorpark.info) for more. Appeal highlights are below:

The Austin Mennonite Church (AMC), with the help of Stuart Hersh (pro bono consultant), is appealing the project with full support from both the Windsor Park Neighborhood Association and The Windsor Park Neighborhood Plan Contact Team.

Further details about the Appeal and process were provided by Elaine Ramirez, the Board of Adjustment Liaison, and will be shared via the WPNA email listsery. Our understanding is that interested parties (those located within 500' of the property) will be notified of the appeal and can testify at the meeting. Since we understand that the process doesn't always cover all the details that you might want to know, we are inviting neighbors to join the WPNA meeting on July 9th to hear from us about the appeal

and answer any questions. The team will discuss why we are appealing (what it's about, why it's important to us) and then open it up for Q&A.

July 2022 Mueller Update

Rick Krivoniak

Brian Dolezal of Catellus presented an "ecological" update at the RMMAPIAC July meeting. Mueller is a bit over 700 acres, of which 140 acres are green space. Along with several large medians and the Dell Children's Healing Garden, there are a dozen publicly accessible parks, ranging in size from the 30-acre Lake Park with its 6.5-acre lake and 1000+ seat amphitheater, to small pocket parks like Paggi Park with the Bocce Ball court. Over 15,000 trees will be planted, and all Mueller homes will be within 600' of a park or open space. Mueller was the first US neighborhood to get Gold LEED certification, and has also been granted Stage 3 Certification from the US Green Building Council. 

This month's Yard of the Month winners are Dina and Ted Matthews of 2211 Vanderbilt Lane. The Matthews will receive a \$50.00 gift certificate from Shoal Creek Nursery.

Ted and Dina have lived on Vanderbilt for three years. Wanting to keep their water usage and maintenance low, they consulted the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center, the Fort Worth Botanic Garden, and *Neil Sperry's Complete Guide to Texas Gardening*. They also learned from their friends' and neighbors' landscapes and fields of wildflowers.

Though they have a large expanse of lawn, they love their flower beds. They have two large beds in their front yard and plantings near their house. Their corner yard has nothing but flowers. They also have two large Elm trees and a Fig tree. Flowers surround the elm trees.

Dina and Ted have Rock Rose, Yarrow, Echinacea, Bee Balm, Plumbago, Calla Lilies, Russian Sage, Salvia Coccinea, several varieties of Lantana, including Trailing and Texas, Canna, Dianthus, Indian Blanket, Zinnias in many colors, and several Roses. The Roses include Heritage Graham Thomas, Eutin Floribunda, Soul Sister,

Beverly, and Magnifiscent, a Hybrid Tea. Except for the Hybrid Tea, which they ordered from Jackson & Perkins, they ordered their roses from Chamblee's Rose Nursery in Tyler and The Antique Rose Emporium in Independence, Texas.

To prepare their beds, Ted and Dina worked in organic matter and mulched them. Now they carefully water by hand. Their greatest pleasure comes from seeing tiny plants and seeds thrive and multiply. The Matthews advise observing how much sun you get in your prospective garden. Prepare the soil. When you plant, leave room to add more plants next year. Enjoy the results.


SILENT AUCTION PARTY AND FUNDRAISER -

Uncomfortable Conversations

I recently had to utter the words that no agent wants to say and no seller wants to hear, "We've been on the market for over 2 weeks, the market has shifted, and I recommend we make a price adjustment." Thankfully, I'd been keeping my clients informed throughout the process, they trusted me and agreed. We adjusted the price, did a marketing push, and had multiple offers by the end of the weekend. We've seen an influx of properties on the market and with mortgage rates at 6%, buyers have pulled back. As of this writing, we have over 2 months of inventory on the market, which has been unheard of in Austin. I've said it before, but proper pricing and paying attention to what the market is telling us if more important than ever.

Meet Your Historic Neighbor - Rick Krivoniak

In this 40th anniversary of the Windsor Park Neighborhood Association, I have done a lot of research on the genesis and history of the group and one name keeps showing up, decade after decade. In fact, you will find his name on page 2 of this very newsletter, author of the Mueller Update.

Rick Krivoniak first came to Windsor Park in 1967 with his parents and lived on Westmoor Drive, graduating from Reagan High School in 1972 and then completed UT school of architecture. Rick bought his house on Delwood Circle in 1982, just when WPNA was being invented. "We were members of Trinity Presbyterian Church when Bruce Rockstroh first brought up this neighborhood association idea." Bruce was the new community liaison for the church, and his job was to get involved with the community. Rick says he doesn't actually remember that first meeting, which occurred at the church, but he's pretty sure he attended. Rick says many of the first organizers and officers were members of the church. I inform Rick that he was listed on the first library committee in 1983, which he also does not remember.

However, Rick does remember serving in every officer position of WPNA, including two separate times as President. (He's the Grover Cleveland of Windsor Park). It appears that Rick is the longest serving officer of WPNA (more than a decade), and has held some kind of official position representing Windsor Park since the mid 80's. "In the beginning we were going to city council meetings to ask them not to close our leased library space in the shopping center" Rick reports. There had been talk of cutting the library budget. This is the first real community action from WPNA, and it worked. The library was not closed, and eventually the city built Windsor Park a permanent facility.

Rick became interested in Mueller airport in 1983 when there was a newspaper story discussing re-designing the airport which showed a lengthened runway that would cross 51st street and end up in Windsor Park. Thus began Rick's four-decade involvement in the airport, first to move it, then to figure out what to do with those 700 acres. Rick was on the very first Airport Process and Goals Task Force from 1996, which laid the ground work for what we now call the Mueller Development. Rick was appointed to the first Mueller Commission in 2000, upon which he has continuously served and is currently Vice-Chair. If you enjoy the many amenities that have come from the Mueller development, be sure to thank Rick for the 5000 meetings he has attended in the past quarter century which lead to what we see today.

On his voluminous list of accomplishments, Rick was President during the effort to improve WPNA by-laws, which is a tedious but necessary task. There was a long discussion of inventing different categories of WPNA memberships, which included a moment on how to define a "family" for the "family



membership". Rick, being openly gay, watched with amazement as a room full of straight people came to the conclusion that a family is not just married people with children, but was defined as "whatever we choose as our family." Rick's voice cracks while telling this story. "I didn't know I lived in such a cool neighborhood. It meant a lot."

In January 2000 it was Rick who was in the room providing neighborhood support for film directors Robert Rodriguez and Rick Linklater as they met with Austin Mayor Kirk Watson to pitch the idea of converting airplane hangers into film studios after Mueller airport had closed. This was a huge step for Austin's film industry, and put us on the Hollywood map.

In the most recent events regarding the development of Windsor Village, Rick has been on the team to analyze and organize WPNA's response to the developer's rejection of city code requiring significant amount of commercial space in their new design. Rick has again put in lots of time and energy to fight this plan, from speaking to City Council members, attending Contact Team meetings, to helping craft letters and appeals in what is turning out to be the first time in the history of the City of Austin that someone is fighting a proposed VMU project. "We are in new territory" Rick says, "and the city council doesn't know what to do." At the moment WPNA has filed an appeal, and the issue will be officially reviewed by the Board of Adjustment. Judging from past experience, WPNA is in good hands when Rick is on the case.
