#### Climate Corner - New National Era?

Since its climate resolution last year, WPNA has kept an eye on national legislation related to climate, to keep its pledge of seeking positive action from legislators and keeping neighbors informed about key items that individuals can ask for. Under a Biden administration, what climate moves are likely to occur, and what legislation if any is lined up?

According to Senators Lisa Murkowski (R-AL), chair of the Senate Energy Committee, and Sheldon Whitehouse (D-RI), member of the Senate Climate Solutions Caucus, the likeliest moves are executive orders such as rescinding orders by President Trump that weakened regulations on polluters, reduced efficiency standards for automobiles and appliances, and opened federal lands to oil and gas extraction. Another likely presidential option is to rejoin the Paris Agreement on Climate Change. Based on an article in Greentech Media which interviewed both Senators, two key avenues of legislation are also possible even if Republicans do, as expected, control the Senate 2021-2022.

Bipartisan support already exists, Murkowski says, for increased R&D spending to develop better energy technology to balance the electrical grid as it scales up renewables use. Similar support is also there for investing in transmission capacity that is needed to bring wind and solar into existing grids. These are relatively "realistic" asks that neighbors can urge our Senators and Congressman to support. The Climate Committee plans to advocate for these directly, but additional messages from each neighbor increase the

#### Mueller Update- December 2020

A report on Mueller's affordable housing program was on the agenda for November's Commission meeting. The program is still very successful, though the pandemic has had an impact. A few families have required some financial assistance, and it's anticipated more may need help in early 2021. Fortunately, the Mueller Foundation is capable of providing that assistance. Besides three tax-credit apartment projects where all but a few units are affordable, most other apartment complexes at Mueller have at least 10% of their units available for tenants that qualify under the affordable program, with incomes at or below 60% of Austin's Median Family Income.

For a family of four in Austin, current MFI is \$58,550, and \$41,000 for one person. Habitat for Humanity has a row of homes nearing completion across from the new Jesse Andrews Park, and as a new section of Mueller opens, a number of new affordable row homes, garden homes and condominiums will be built. Homes in the affordable program are priced well below market value, selling in the high \$100,000s to low \$200,000s for those at or below 80% of MFI, or \$78,100 for a family of four, or \$62,500 for two person household.

One of Austin's best sushi restaurants, Kyoten Sushiko closed earlier this year, but chef Michael Che will soon open a new contender in the category. Che plans to open omakase sushi restaurant Tsuke Edomae in the same Mosaic at Mueller space at 4600 Mueller Blvd. #1035 in March.

Due to the pandemic, Mueller's NOEL Tower lighting event was held virtually on Saturday, November 26<sup>th</sup> this year, a bit earlier than usual. Following the City of Austin's protocol, the play, exercise and sports facilities at Mueller's parks have opened with notices to follow COVID-19 precautions. Mueller's pools have closed for the season, but are anticipated to open to the public for Memorial Day 2021.

## December 2020 Meet Your Neighbor - Carl and Linda Harvey

Our neighbors on Westminster Drive since 1982, Carl and Linda celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary this past August. Both native Austinites, the couple have lived on the East Side their entire lives, in Windsor Park for 38 years and delivered newsletters for 30 plus years. I think they are the longest continually serving newsletter delivery couple in Windsor Park history.

When I met the Harveys for this interview their house was being boxed up as they prepared to move closer to their family in Manor, so this is a bittersweet moment for the couple, who raised three children in this house.

Carl and Linda both taught Math in AISD. "What are the odds of that?" I innocently ask. It turns out, the odds were exceptionally high. "I saw



God putting us together." Carl says confidently, fifty years after the fact. My first question: How did y'all meet? Carl announces: "We met in the yearbook." Linda looks surprised. And then Carl proceeds to unravel this very long tale of how he knew about Linda several years before they met, and how he would try to find her, and the more he told this story, the more it sounded like stalking. Linda felt the same way. Apparently, it was her first time to hear the story; Carl had some explaining to do. "I wanted to meet her and I finally got the chance." Linda picks up the story from there, realizing with some astonishment that even after 50 years, there are surprises yet uncovered.

Carl and Linda taught in several schools in Austin over their careers. Linda was hired at Reagan High school in 1979, a few years prior to purchasing their house on Westminster Drive. She taught there until her retirement from the classroom in 2003. Linda then worked with UTeach at the University of Texas as a consultant for the next 17 years evaluating student teachers, which kept her in touch with changes in the profession. "It's just fascinating today what teachers can do in a classroom with technology." Then she frowns and points out her regret that we have stopped teaching grammar and handwriting.


Carl retired from teaching in 1996 and then heard the call to serve and has been Pastor of Turning Point Bible Fellowship for 24 years. Linda tells me the church is small in size but very community and family oriented with their adult children and spouses -Tenea, Shaneen and Sheldon, and grandkids very involved as ministry leaders. Linda serves as Women's Director and is a Group Leader with Bible Study Fellowship leading a Zoom class every Thursday for what she calls "a diverse group of women." Their oldest son Carl Jr., an electrical engineer at Cirrus Logic, is a pastor and the football chaplain at LBJ High School. Their other son Christopher, an administrator in Manor ISD, is a current member of the Manor City Council, and their daughter, LaChanda is a Health Coach for BackBone Wellness Center, and is currently in charge of helping Carl and Linda with health and diet changes. They have nine wonderful grandchildren, several of whom accompanied them delivering newsletters!

Their church has a grant to distribute food in the neighborhood and every Tuesday or Wednesday they oversee a team to box up food from their church kitchen allowing people to come by and pick up a box. They also volunteer every year at the Operation Turkey Thanksgiving event. In the early days the Harveys had 2 different newsletter delivery routes. "What I like is you get to talk to your neighbors here." Carl says delivering the newsletter brought his whole family into regular contact with their neighbors. "We learned names, stood out in the yard and talked to people." Carl remembers Mr. Albert, who would "cut your yard if it you wanted, watched your house when you were away, tell you who came by, and put up your trash can if you weren't home. He was a great neighbor." Linda recalls being on the Harris PTA where she met Gloria Neunaber back in the 80's, and first got involved with WPNA. There are many fond memories here.

Ironically this edition of WOW will be the first one not delivered by the Harveys. Congratulations to the Harveys on 50 years of marriage. Good luck and Godspeed.

## Yard of the Month – December 2020 - 1607 Glenvalley Drive

Ashley and Whit Williams of 1607 Glenvalley Drive are the December winners. Like many of our other winners Ashley and Whit got ideas from other yards in the neighborhood. They also got ideas from books and from landscapes in other parts of Texas. Ashley is a trained wildlife Habitat Steward and their yard has been a Certified Habitat for over 10 years.

This is the second time that Whit and Ashley have won Yard of the Month. When they won in 2008, they had grass all over their front yard. A plumbing problem that forced them to dig up much of their yard changed everything Now they have a small area of grass. The rest of their yard is gravel.

They have a Bur Oak, a California Fan Palm, Sago Palms, a Pomegranate tree, some Crepe Myrtles, a Retama tree, some Agaves including two huge Agave Americanas, Lantana, a Bamboo Muhly, and a Tropical Milkweed plant. Earlier this year the milkweed was a great host to the Monarch butterflies.

Their favorite plant is a Rose that they got as a clipping from Whit's grandmother's garden in Alabama. They got here and planted it in their yard where it would get some sun. It was quite healthy and sent out shoots that wanted to twist around something. It turns out that the rose was a pink climber named New Dawn. To keep it from running along the ground, they added a trellis.
