December 2023 Mueller Update

Several paid-street-parking changes are coming to Austin, and due to the popularity of the Sunday Farmer's Market, to Mueller. If you haven't already, I recommend you download the free ParkATX app on your Apple or Android phone. It is effective where you see ParkATX app signs and decals, and very soon, where the Residential Parking Permit (RPP) program is in place, as it is on several Mueller streets. Among the app's benefits are two free 15-minute parking sessions every 24-hours, the ability to remotely add time to your space, and if you have any unused time when leaving the parking space, simply stop the parking session and the remaining time will be refunded back into your wallet. Mueller's Browning Hangar has become a popular community gathering space, and for small and large events at times. The Master Development Agreement calls for the sale of the hangar to a private entity, though it is to remain at least partially accessible to the community. Catellus has had a lot of interest in it over the years, but only recently found someone they think will be a good fit. We hope to hear more about plans for the hanger early next year.

Yard of the Month - December 2023 - 1403 **Larkwood Drive**

The December winners are Tyler Melmoth and Kimberly Harris, who live at 1403 Larkwood Drive. they moved here from the Pacific Northwest thirteen months ago, they have had to learn a new way to garden with plants that were foreign to them. They have enjoyed learning about xeriscaping and landscaping with rocks and dry beds.

When they visited local nurseries Tyler and Kimberly tried to limit their purchases to natives and well These included various Lantanas, adapted plants. including Purple and White Trailing Lantana, Texas Lantana, and New Gold Lantana. The last is a hybrid. They also have Plumbago, Pride of Barbados, Purple Coneflower, Firebush, Desert Globemallow, Batface Cuphea, Passion Vine, Zinnia, various Agaves, and Mexican Feather, Bamboo Muhly & Gulf Muhly Grasses.

Tyler and Kimberly started working on their front yard last March-April. They did most of it themselves except for some large boulders which a large muscular friend moved into place. Using rocks as part of their yard allowed them to eliminate some of the grass in their yard. This cuts down on their water usage. They have also tried to choose plants that do not use much water.

When they started to work on their yard it took them one to several hours a day. Now it does not take Tyler and Kimberly much time, only about an hour of weeding and mowing once a month.

They advise the novice landscapers to look up their gardening zone on Pinterest. Investigate local nurseries and walk around the neighborhood to see what looks good. Kimberly and Tyler will receive a \$50.00 gift certificate from Shoal Creek Nursery. While you are there, be sure to greet the cats and admire the waterfall.

Do not be shy; if you like a certain yard, or more than one, tell us. We cannot visit every yard in the neighborhood each month. We may not have seen your yard, or your neighbor's yard. 

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Ox beetles

Texas is home to three species of Ox beetles, with the most common being Strategus aloeus (others are S. antaeus and S. mormon). These beetles are large, reddish brown and show sexual dimorphism. Males have protruding horns on the pronotum, a platelike structure that covers the thorax. Adults are winged with front wings hardened into an elytra while hind wings are membranous and used for flight. Ox beetles are in the family Scarabaeidae, along with May and June beetles, so they have a similar body shape but are much larger.

Ox beetles have a complete life cycle with four life stages- egg, larva (called a white grub), pupa, and adult. Ox beetles, both adults and larvae, are not typically considered pests although they sometimes feed on plant roots. Eggs are laid in rotten wood or on roots in sandy soil. Larvae are typical grubs and are creamy white, c-shaped, with 6 legs and a well-developed head capsule. Grubs last about 6-7 months and then pupate in the soil.

The Aloeus ox beetle has major and minor males that have variations in the size of horns on the pronotum. Major males have large horns, two on each side at the rear of the pronotum and one towards the front in the center, while minor males have stubby horns. Males use horns for fighting other males over mating privileges. Female Aloeus ox beetles do not have horns, but have a small raised area at the front center of the pronotum that is used for digging in soil.

Aloeus ox beetles are active in Texas spring through late summer. Adults live 4-6 months and feed on flowers and fruit, but populations are usually not dense enough to cause a lot of damage. Often, larvae are found burrowed



into tree stumps, other decaying wood, or compost piles where they are beneficial decomposers. While typically larvae are not considered to be problematic, there have been reports of larvae damaging palms.

Is now a good time to buy/sell?

My advice is always "Buy when you can," and "Sell when you need to."

So if you can afford to buy in this market, I still recommend it. You will be recieving a higher interest rate than those in the past few years, but you have SO much more negotiating power right now. Once interest rates start dropping, prices will likely start rising again. Many builders are still offering a lot of concessions and lower interest rates.

If you can hold off selling, I recommend waiting. Only 6 homes closed in October and we currently have 30 listed in the neighborhood, meaning buyers have a lot to choose from. Unless you have a truely unique and desirable property, buyers are holding most of the cards right now.
